What are Stations of the Cross?

There will be 10 stations which represent an event in the last week of Jesus' life.

The stations will be in the sanctuary and courtyard and will be self-guided.

You can come anytime during the 3-hour time period and stay as long as you would like. There will be a "quiet place" if you just want to simply be still or pray.
