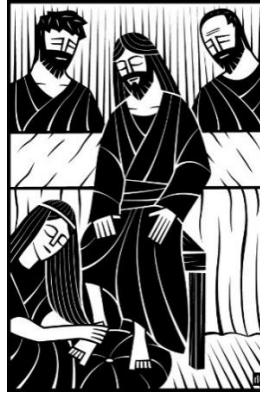

## **MISSION TRIP**

### **DiRT (Disaster Recovery Team) is back!**

We weren't able to have a mission trip in 2020 or 2021 but are currently making plans for 2022. The trip would be from the evening of Sunday, April 10, through the afternoon of Friday, April 15th. (Holy Week-Holy Work) Details are still being worked out, but we will be working in the Paradise and/or Redding area. The nature of the work is still unknown, but there should be work for all skill levels, even unskilled. Housing for the group will be in a church. The cost should be around \$150-\$200 for food, gas, supplies, and housing. If you are unable to come for the full time but would be able to join for a day or two, that can be accommodated, and the cost adjusted accordingly. There is a minimum age of 16 and you must be vaccinated for COVID. More information will be shared as plans solidify so keep watching for more announcements.
